

From 07/01/2022 to 06/30/2023 via ports Australia exported **44 920.7 thousand tons** of grain and legumes.

63.5% of total exports came from for wheat - **28 515.2 thousand tons** 

The largest volume of shipments of grain passed through the port of Kwinana.

During the 2022/2023 season, 7 996.5 thousand tons of wheat, rapeseed, barley, lupine and oats were sent abroad through the port terminals.



The exporter ranking continues to be topped by **CBH Grain**, a farmers' cooperative, Australia's largest grain exporter.

For the 2022/23 season, the company shipped **9 435.1 thousand tons** of grain and leguminous cargo abroad.

Export of cereals and legumes: statistics on importing countries

At the end of the 2022/23 season, **China** became the main buyer of grains and legumes from Australia (23.2% of the total).

China mainly importswheat: for the 2022/23 season, the country **received 6 779.1 thousand tons** from Australia.

Australia also exported grains and legumes to Indonesia, the Philippines, Japan, the United Arab Emirates, Saudi Arabia, Vietnam,South Korea, Belgium, India, New Zealand, Iraq and Thailand.

The TOP-5 buyers of Australian wheat included:

Indonesia - 4 366.6 thousand tons Philippines – 3 144.1 thousand tons South Korea – 2 447.5 thousand tons Vietnam - 2 425.8 thousand tons

## Logistic OS

Australia is one of the world's largest producers and exporters of wheat, steadily enters the TOP-10.

In 2021, before the events of 2022, the world will export was supplied 200 million tons of wheat.

Of these, 25.5 million tons were exported Australia, allowing her on this indicator take 2nd place among the world's largest wheat sellers.

A country that occupies a huge continent, with a warm climate, has grown in 2021, 32 million tons of wheat - less than Ukraine, which in the same year in terms of volume export was in 5th place.

But Australia exported wheat significantly larger than Ukraine - 25.5 million tons against 19.4 million tons.

In terms of export volumes in 2021, the only the country that exported more wheat, than Australia was Russia. Australia ranks third in financial performance in 2021 in the world ranking selling wheat for \$7.2 billion with 13% of the global volume.

In 2022, Australia produced 36.6 million tons of wheat, which amounted to 5% of world production.

Among the top 10 manufacturers crops in 2022 Australia took 6th place.

Relatively small population compared to countries in the TOP-10 producers and exporters of wheat, allows Australia to export a significant part of the harvest.

In fiscal year 2023, according to forecasts, value of wheat exports from Australia will amount to 15.27 billion Australian dollars.
